

Jesus is the Eucharist!

Come and learn about the Jewish roots and the meaning of the Eucharist.

When you made your first Holy Communion you were taught that the consecrated host was the body, blood, soul, and divinity of Jesus. You still know that is true. Reflect on what you do after the Eucharist is placed on your tongue. You thank Him for redeeming you through His passion and death. You thank Him for giving you all that you have and ask Him to give you the strength when the pitfalls of life arrive.

You believe, but do you know the real history of the Eucharist? The Old Testament give us many hints of the coming of the Eucharist. How did the miracles of wine, water, loaves and fishes lead us to “Lamb of God,” “Bread of Life,” “The Body and Blood of Christ.” These phrases are uttered at every Mass. Where did they come from in scripture?

After Jesus feeds the four, then five thousand people He tells them that He will give them the bread of eternal life. They clamber for this bread. “I am the bread which came down from heaven.” Later he says, “unless you eat the flesh of the Son of man and drink his blood you have no life in you.” - John 6:54 The next time you go to church, look at the tabernacle and see the host as Jesus looking back.
